Welcome Tables and Greeters

These are the first faces people see when they walk in the door

- Greeters open the doors for and welcome members and guests. Volunteers should be able to stand for an hour or more, open doors and be welcoming and attentive to all.
- Welcome table volunteers sit at the welcome tables, helping members find their name tags and giving High Holy Day Seasons Members, members' guest, and local visitors help with nametags and anything else they need. These volunteers should be organized and willing to follow a written list of tasks.
- Nametag team volunteers are needed during times of heavy traffic. They help incoming members and guests find their name tags and keep the tag boxes organized.
